

Recommendations for, and voluntary contributions to a Kesagami Range Caribou Action Plan

Clarification Document Taykwa Tagamou Nation

March 21, 2018

This document re-affirms the implementation intentions discussed and finalized by Taykwa Tagamou in November 2014 regarding the alternative model for caribou and forestry in the Abitibi River Forest. Taykwa Tagamou Nation (TTN) reconfirmed its lead in decision making in its Community Interest Zone (also known as the 9 townships). In addition to making decisions about future forestry activities in this zone, TTN indicated they wanted to ensure the following activities would not be impacted by the 3 zone plan in general and any overlay designation (early action) specifically:

- Any existing, proposed, or potential future Hydro developments on the Abitibi River system
- Continued use of the We Tum road leading to the James Bay coast for the foreseeable future;
- Upgrade work to the road leading to the New Post reserve;
- Continued use of snowmobile trail managed by the Cochrane Snowmobile club that runs through TTN land and through the middle of their reserve;
- Protection from Harvesting into perpetuity of Gerloch Creek area;
- All harvesting rights are to be continue exclusively by TTN/ Island Falls Forestry area in the Community Interest Zone and is exempted from the Caribou Strategy and,

These and other issues identified through a Consultation Process and Legal Review as to protect our Treaty and Inherent Rights.
